Introduction

In pursuant to Section 6 (1) of the Electoral Commission Act 2019, it is my privilege to present this Official Report of the General Election 2021.

This report summarizes the the key works that the Office of the Electoral Commission ("OEC") carried out in reparation for the 9th April 2021 General Election throughout the five (5) years Electoral Cycle which started with voter registration activities and ended with the declaration of official results following the final count.

With the aid of graphs and tables, useful information and data are extracted to allow for a comparative analysis with the 2016 General Election and a forecast of a potential trend in voting behavior and administrative challenges going into the 2026 General Election.

Voter registration, review of the electoral roll, public awareness programs, civic and voter education were the main focus of OEC during the pre election phase of this electoral cycle. This is mainly due to the fact that the passage of the Electoral Act 2019 and the Electoral Constituencies Act 2019 introduced major reforms to the electoral process of the country.

12,931 new registered voters were recorded for the 2021 General Election. The majority of these new voters are those born between the years 1991 to 2000. At the closure of Rolls on 8th October 2020, the total number of registered voters registered on the main electoral rolls for the 51 electoral constituencies was 128,822.

This significant increase in the number of new registered voters also required a 14% increase in the number of Polling Booths allocated for this General Election for both Upolu and Savaii. A total of 409 Polling Booths were appropriately assigned throughout the country, 338 Booths for Polling Day and 71 Booths assigned for Pre-Polling.

Pre-polling is one of the new aspects of our electoral process that was introduced by the Electoral Act 2019. This allows time for voters who have attained 65 years and above (and their carers), those with disabilities (and their carers), voters travelling outside of Samoa a week before the General elections and those working in essential services to cast their votes during the pre-polling before the General Election.

While this aspect of the electoral process had some challenges during its implementation, those eligible, namely the elderly and those with disabilities welcomes this change. It is now a matter of fine tuning this part of the process to ensure it progresses smoothly in future elections.

One of the highlights of this election was the increase in the number of candidates nominated compared to the GE 2016 by 16%. For the first time in the history of elections in this Country, five (5) Political Parties contested the election.

To keep up with technology in elections, Our ICT Division designed and implemented a Vote Caster System to speed up the searching and verifying of voters at the polling stations during the polling hours. The Vote Caster is an in-house designed software hosted locally at the OEC Data Center with all the best practice ICT standards incorporated to ensure the integrity of the voting process.

From experience, as an electoral management body, the April 9th 2021 General Elections is perhaps the most challenging elections that OEC had ever managed and delivered.

While OEC is confident by the fact that the majority of its objective targets were met, the reality remains that elections are forever evolving, therefore legal frameworks that govern elections must also evolve to cater for newer trends that impacted on the administrative, legal and political aspects of the electoral process.

The activation of Article 44(1)(A) certainly generated a lot of commentary both locally and overseas. As the body responsible for the activation, we certainly put ourselves out there to the merciless sword of many commentators - both qualified and the keyboard warriors -who contributed to the conversation around this important component of our Parliament setup.

Undoubtedly, the commentary that took place around this issue will only help perfect this part of our Constitution and also our Parliamentary Membership around women representation at the highest level of decision making in the country.

We now take this opportunity to extend, on behalf of the team at OEC, gratitude to our former Minister, Hon. Faaolesa Katopau AINU'u for his endless support, assurance and guidance throughout the last five years which gave us confidence to take on the challenges that managing an election always brings.

I also welcome Hon. Faualo Harry Schuster, the new Minister for OEC. We are looking forward to working with him going into the 2026 General Election given his vast experience in practicing law both as a senior lawyer and as a Judge.



The highest number of new registrations in this period is from the 21-30 year old age group. Voter turnout in the 2016 General Elections does not reflect a high percentage of voters in this particular age group in comparison to the total population. At the resumption of registration in April 2016, public notices on TV and printed media targeted citizens who had qualified to vote in 2016 but have not registered. As a result, the majority of the number of new registrations recorded in Upolu increased significantly if compared to the same post-election period of 2011.

The Constituency of Sagala Le Falefa recorded the highest number with 29 new registrations from the 21-30 years old age group. In total registrations, the Electorate of Aana Alofi No.3 recorded the highest number of new registrations with 36. This is attributed to the special registration program carried out on request from the EFKS of Sagafili in mid-November 2016.

The Pre-Registration of College Students is the main reason for a significant increase in the number of new registrations for Savaii with 640 eligible voters for the next General Elections in 2021. The E-Roll System has been programmed to accept new registrations for citizens born before the 4th of March 2000 who will turn 21 years by the next General Elections in 2021.

In addition to pre-registered voters, 499 new registrations were recorded from the rest of Savaii. In collaboration with village representatives, new registrations were also processed in the community together with the confirmation of deceased voters. These activities were administered concurrently with the Pre-Registration Project.

Voters residing on any land other than customary within the Vaimauga and Faleata Constituency qualify under either of the two Urban Constituencies. Urban West recorded 74 new voters while Urban East recorded 50 new voters within the current Financial Year. Confirmation of residential status was made possible through the use of the census 2011 procured from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics, records of registered freehold landowners from MNRE and Samoa Land Corporation.

The high number of New Registrations for Constituencies located in Savaii is attributed to the Pre-Registration Program that was carried out in all Government/Private Schools (Table 8) in Savaii. And although there was no registration program for the constituencies located within the Urban Area – qualified voters turned up at the main office for their Registration.

New registrations in both Urban Constituencies were a result of Un-Registered Lists publicized on Media Outlets (TV & Newspaper). Others came on their own volition because of the awareness in prosecution of unregistered voters and the monetary fine of SAT2000.00 for failing to register in accordance with the repealed **Electoral Act 1963**.




Figure 1: Pre & New Registration By Age Group 17/18





For the Electoral Constituencies situated in Upolu a total number of 427 new voter registrations were recorded for this financial year. A total number of 331 new registrations for Savaii. Fa'asalelelaga No.3 has the highest number of New Registration for this Financial Year with the total of 251 New Registration Recorded. This was because Fa'asalelelaga No.3 held a by-election in the beginning of the year 2019. The Registration had held a Special Registration program for this particular constituency in preparation for the Fa'asalelelaga No. 3 By-Election.

In addition after the Fa'asalelelaga No3 By-Election the OEC commences its official public awareness program for recent amendments to the Electoral Act. A Registration team is attached to this program and some of the public especially eligible voters residing in the rural communities had made use of this opportunity to register on their respective Electoral Constituent Rolls.




Figure 2 - New Registration by Age Group 18/19

As evident on the table above majority of New Registrations for this Financial Year are from the ages of 21 to 30. Post General Election programs for the Registration focused mainly on encouraging young people to register in order for them to cast their vote on Election Day. Fa'asalelelaga No.3 by-election have also contributed to this great increase in New Registration for this age group. Furthermore we continued on publicising notices of un-registered voters on various media outlets and this has been very effective in luring in unregistered voters of various ages.

The shocking amount of new registered voters within the ages of 41 to 80 are citizens who only came in to register only because they needed the voter's identification (ID) for identity verification as enquired by various financial institutions. A few of this number are those citizens who reside permanently overseas but still wishes to take part in Elections locally.






Figure 3: Percentage New Registration By Qualifications 18/19

Registration activities were based on the OEC Strategic Plan 2016 – 2021 under Objective 2: To enhance registration systems and processes

Immediately after the 2016 GE the Registration division had undertook a detail review of its daily operation. The objective underlined by the OEC Strategic Plan was the main drive behind its determination to execute various fieldwork activities that were carried out within this 5 year gap.





The abrupt increase in the number of transfer application recorded for the 2019-2020 FY is an expected trend of voter's last minute interest to update and transfer their voter registration to a preferred Electoral constituency, provided that they satisfy the legal requirements. Similarly to the previous pre-election years, an influx of voters came in last minute to transfer their voter registration.

4. REFORMS ELECTORAL ACT 1963

The reform of the Electoral Act 1963 saw the separation of the Administration and Operation provisions from one principal Act to two separate Acts when the Electoral Act 2019 and Electoral Commission Act 2019 were enacted. The Constituencies Act 1963 was also reform and repealed by the Electoral Constituency Act 2019.

The Electoral Act 1963 and Constituencies Act 1963 went through meticulous review during the Commission of Inquiry (COI) and also through the collaboration of the Legal Team of our Office and the Drafting Team of the Attorney General.

The final product of all the reform and review saw the introduction of new provisions for the Electoral Act 2019, such as, the registration of political party, registration of voters, the eligibility of candidates, electoral offences, the process election petitions and other provisions recommended by the Commission of Inquiry 2016.

Major features of reform that was introduced in the new Electoral Act 2019 were:

- The Political Parties Registration fee of \$3000 and an annual fee of \$1000 to ensure that there would be a proper registration for all existing political parties after every election.
- Registration of voters' eligibility was focused on the place of residence with the option of choosing to register to the constituency where the voter holds a matai title. This is to ensure that people are given the chance to choose their place of residence rather than de-registering their matai titles for the purposes of election. This change was a way forward to one of the issues that was raised by the COI report regarding people that do not live in the constituency but became eligible to be registered in the constituency because of their kinship or matai connection to the constituency.
- The eligibility to transfer was also changed from five (5) years to ten (10) years from the day of a voter's first registration or the day of the last transfer; however there was a provision that exempted everyone from this new transfer rule giving the people twelve (12) months to decide on the new eligibility to register to their place of residence or the place where they are a matai.
- There were no more special booths but voters can only cast their votes from their respective Constituencies except for a category of people that are qualified as special voters. These special voters are people that will be working on Election Day such as the essential services and officials working for the office of the electoral commission.
- Compulsory voting is one of the new features which ensure that everyone who has registered must vote. This was a way to boost people's interest in election so that they can be more involved in the process of choosing our leaders.
- Campaigning was one of the reforms that the Office introduced in Samoa's elections as a corrupt-free and legal way of promoting the candidates running for election. Allowing them to use pamphlets, billboards and public presentations or speech's to connect with their respective constituencies'. This was to ensure that candidates do not conduct illegal or corrupt practices to get peoples votes.

These are some of the major reforms that were introduced to the electoral system as a way for the office to clearly grasp and achieve its vision for a free, fair and inclusive election.

4.1 LEGISLATION AMENDMENT.

On the repealed of the Electoral Act 1963 became the passage of the Electoral laws i.e. Electoral Act 2019, Electoral Constituencies 2019 & Electoral Commission Act 2019 on 31 January 2019. Since the passing of the Electoral Act 2019 (“the Act”) three major amendments were made to the Act. This was to strengthen provisions regarding the process for the conduct of elections in Samoa; to meet the objective of the Office of the Electoral Commission on fair and free elections; to make clarification and to re-define the application of the monotaga requirement to provide fairness to candidates that will be contesting from Constituencies affected in the re-defining of the electoral boundaries; and to improve electoral requirements and processes for by-elections that may arise after the 2021 general elections.

5. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY.

The use of technology in the electoral process is on the rise. Following the successful implementation of the votecaster system in the by-election for Gagaifomauga 3, the same system was deployed for the first time in a General Election.


Like any new system, challenges were encountered and can be addressed and fine-tuned, given General Elections happen every 5 years.

5.1 VOTECASTER SYSTEM


Votecaster System is an in-house built software to assist the search and verification functions of the electoral process in election. The software is completely owned by OEC.

The ultimate goal of introducing this system to the General Election 2021:

- i. mitigate dual vote possible occurrences.
- ii. capture vote casted data.
- iii. comprehensive reporting capabilities using captured data.

5.2 Private Sector

The Telecommunication Companies, namely Digicel and Vodafone, were engaged to provide connectivity from each polling booth to OEC Data Center.

The votecaster system utilized both Digicel and Vodafone Cell Network, with respectively owned Mifi devices to establish VPN connections with SSL and password protected security to OEC datacenter cluster housed in the DBS building.

5.3 Laptops

A total of 360 laptops were configured to run the Votecaster system for all polling booths during pre-polling and general election day.

A total of 420 mifis were used with 360 votecaster laptops in all ordinary polling booths. Some polling booths in Upolu and Savaii were assigned with both Digicel and Vodafone Mifis to address weak signal coverage of both telco cell networks. Total of 15 laptops were configured to run e-roll system for mobile booths.

5.4 eRoll System

All 360 laptops have also been installed backup e-copies of all electoral constituency photo polls. In the event the votecaster system is down, these e-copy photo rolls were accessed via a local web-interface to search and verify voters' identification.

e-Roll system was installed on 15 laptops to cater for search and verification in mobilized locations both in Upolu and Savaii. This system was also available in the main operation center at Tuanaimato for OEC staff to help with queries from AEO IT in the polling booths via phone if votecaster system is down or AEO IT has difficulties identifying the voter.

5.5 Trainings



There were two types of trainings held for all AEO IT polling officials in preparation for general election, initial trainings and refresher trainings. All AEO IT trainings were held at TATTE except for IT administrator trainings which were held at DBS building conference room.

Furthermore, votecaster user manuals were also made available to all IT polling officials involved in the election process from setting up their laptops to using the system, on a step-by-step basis. These were printed and also installed on all laptops for ease of access.

To ensure the successful operation of this new system, full participation was required from all AEO IT and IT Administrators.

5.6 AEOIT Polling Officials

A total of 340 AEO IT operated ordinary polling booths, 222 in Upolu and 103 in Savaii. A total of 10 IT Administrators (5 in Savaii & 5 in Upolu) were mobilized to provide onsite technical support for AEO ITs in their designated polling stations.

A total of 30 IT administrators were assigned to manage the main operation center in Tuanaimato Multipurpose Gym, to provide technical support to AEO ITs in all polling booths.



5.7 Livefeed.

The main purpose of this website was for the public access to information about the election process during election day i.e., election results and number of votes casted per booth and overall. This was hosted at CSL as load balancing.

5.8 Server Architecture.

The votecaster system was installed on a 3 Node LBFO (Load Balancing Fail Over) Cluster HyperV Core, housed at the OEC Datacenter, DBS building. This setup ensured high availability and load balancing while the general election operations was manned from the remote Operation Center at the Tuanaimato Multipurpose Gym.

5.9 Ownership of ICT in General Election

Votecaster source code was programmed in-house, meaning OEC has total ownership of ICT in the General Election. The transparency of the system in the election process can be audited through this source code.

5.10 ICT Peripherals

A total of 2 Ricoh heavy duty printers and 2 HP printers was used for printing of documents before and during general election. Onsite IT support was required to ensure availability and accessibility of service.

5.11 Remote Operation Center

The OEC office relocated all general election operations to Tuanaimato Multipurpose Gym on the 15th of March. All staff computers, telephones and printers were relocated. To ensure complete remote network functionality, OEC IT implemented all the best practices for the availability of all ICT services and requirements for general election.

OEC IT worked closely with Vodafone Company and CSL to provide fiber connectivity and internet services respectively from remote operation center to Data center at DBS.

5.12 Reporting.

Votecaster system was used to provide user-specific reports on data collected during general election activities.

The expenditure report above reflects the transactions and activities undertaken within the financial period 2020/2021 for the administration of the 2021 general election. The figure above is an increase by 60% compared to the 2016 general election expenditure.

- Covering salaries of 10 part time offices that joined the office in the beginning of the financial year and assist with the registration process. Five wage workers were also hired to assist with repairing of ballot boxes and the hard labour work carried out during the election process.
- Payment of overtime allowance of staff involved in the door to door registration process, the closing of the registration in early October, reviewing of the electoral rolls, work carried out for the preparation and during the election week, and the official count process.
- With the introduction of pre-polling, there was a need to recruit more than 2400 polling official including police officers and IT Administrator. This was another contributing factor to the increase in personnel costs of the election with payment of overnight allowances included for the staff of OEC and all officials staying overnight in the allocated polling venues.

Operating costs reflects activities such as:

- Cost of hire of laptops and internet services through MIFI's to cater the Voter Caster System
- Stationeries and printing of ballot papers, electoral rolls and electoral forms.
- Transportation required to transport polling officials to and from the polling booths which included the charter of the Lady Samoa 11 ferry, hire of buses and vans in both Upolu and Savaii.
- Venues hired as polling booths in villages and district including venues hire to assist with the deployment of polling official for both Upolu and Savaii. Accommodation were also provided for officials assigned to mobile booths as well as members of the staff travelling to and from Savaii for the preparation purposes and during the election week.

7. PUBLIC AWARENESS.



Since the passing of the Electoral Laws there were numerous awareness conducted commencing March 2019 in the Electoral Constituency of Sagaga and Manono-tai. Faleata electoral Constituency was the last constituency for Upolu and in October 2019, the awareness for the new electoral laws began in Savaii at the electoral constituencies of Faasaleleaga. Nearly all the electoral constituencies were covered with the awareness until it was prematurely put on hold due to the Covid19 State of Emergency Proclamations.

After the passing of the Electoral laws we conducted back to back radio talk shows on the new rules to qualify to register and register transfer which are the residence qualification and matai holder qualification. The matai holder qualification requires the person who holds a matai title to choose to register in the village where the matai title exists or where he or she resides. The radio talk show not only was a method of awareness for the new Electoral laws but also in preparation for the By Election of Faasaleleaga No.2 which was held on the 22nd of March 2019.

The Legal & Policy Team together with the Electoral Operation Team carried out awareness through presentations on the provisions of the Electoral laws and operational processes to some Organisations such as the Samoa Law Society, National University of Samoa, Non-Government Organisation (NOLA) and Media.

8. CANDIDATE NOMINATION & POLITICAL PARTIES.

At the closure of nomination at noon on 23rd October, 2020 a total of 200 Candidates nominations were accepted by the Commissioner to compete for the Election.

At the closure of nomination at noon on 23rd October, 2020 a total of 200 Candidates nominations were accepted by the Commissioner to compete for the Election.

However, after Pre election Petitions in which the court order to include candidate from Sagaga 1, Sagaga 2, Aleipata Itupa I Lalo, Faasaleleagag 2 and Salega 1 and removed candidate from Vaimauga 1, Aana Alofi 3, Lepa, Gagaemauga 1 (2) and Alataua Sisifo, the total number of candidates decreased to 199.



At the closure of withdrawal of nomination at noon on 26th March 2021 only 8 Candidates from the Constituencies of Vaimauga 2, Aiga i le tai, Falelatai ma Samatau, Siumu, Lepa, Anoamaa 1, Faasaleleaga 1 and Gagaemauga 1 withdrew their Candidacy leaving 191 Candidates to contest the General Election.

Political Parties Candidates (comparison 2016 & 2021)




Figure 4. Nominated Candidates & Political Parties

9. POLITICAL PARTIES.

This election is recorded down in history as the first election in which five (5) new Political Parties have registered to contest. Out of the five (5) new Parties only 3 Parties had Candidates nominated to contest the election.

After the General Election 2016 there were 9 registered Parties on the Political Party register. However when the new Electoral Act 2019 came into force , seven (7) Political Parties were deregistered due to non-payment of the annual registration fee.

In essence only seven (7) Political Parties are currently registered on the Political Party Register.

10. PRE-ELECTION PETITIONS.

There were twenty (20) matters that were petitioned to the Supreme Court as a result of candidate challenges after the closure of nomination for the General Election 2021. They were candidates from Constituencies of Vaimauga 1, Faleata3, Sagaga 1, Sagaga 2, Aana Alofi 3, Lefaga & Faleaseela, Aiga i le Tai, Lepa, Aleipata Itupa i Lalo, Faasaleleaga 1, Faasaleleaga 2, Gagaemauga 1, Salega 1, Alataua Sisifo and Palauli 3.

Three (3) matters concerning the Constituency of Faleata 3, one (1) was struck out by Court, the other withdrew and one (1) matter that the Commissioner rejected the nomination; the court ruled to remain as the candidate does not qualify. As a result by these nomination challenges, Faleata 3 was deemed uncontested for the 2021 General Election.

Two (2) matters pertaining to the Constituency of Palauli 3 which the court ruled both matters dismissed and the decision by the Commissioner to accept the nomination remained. There were also two (2) matters concerning the constituency of Gagaemauga 1 which the Court ruled to be disqualified as the candidates did not satisfy all the requirements to become a candidate. One (1) other matter that was also struck out by the court was the case of Vaimauga 1 which the applicant and respondent both conceded that the candidate did not render any monotaga. Four (4) other matters were withdrawn which were from the Constituency of Aiga i le Tai, Lefaga & Faleaseela, Faasaleleaga 1 and Faasaleleaga 5.

Three (3) matters that the Commissioner accepted their nomination for Constituency of Lepa, Aana Alofi 3 and Alataua Sisifo were overturned by the Court ordering for these candidates to be disqualified as they do not satisfy the monotaga requirement as stated in the Act. Five (5) matters which were rejected nominations by the Commissioner; the court ruled for the Commissioner to accept these candidates nomination as they all satisfy the requirements to run for the General Election 2021. These were candidates from the Constituency of Sagaga 1, Sagaga 2, Aleipata Itupa i Lalo, Faasaleleaga 2 and Salega 1.

11. UNCONTESTED ELECTIONS.

At the closure of nomination, only Faleata 3 and Lotofaga Constituencies nominated one Candidate to compete for the Election.

However the Constituency of Lepa was added to the list following pre election petition decision and were declared uncontested by the Supreme court resulting in 3 Constituencies unopposed.

12. POLLING OFFICIALS.

Polling Officials are appointed by the Electoral Commissioner pursuant to Sections 12 and 13 of the Electoral Commission Act 2019 to conduct poll as stipulated under Section 56 (1) (2) & (5) of the Electoral Act 2019. It outlines the roles and functions of the Electoral Officer (EO) and Assistant Electoral Officer (AEO) and Section 56 (6) emphasizes the obligation of public servants to become polling officials on the request of the Electoral Commissioner. This was extended to public servants and members of the public working in the private sector giving them the opportunity to participate in the election process.



The number of polling officials recruited was based on the Election Operational Plan with the estimate of 1,600 initially requested to cater for polling booths both Upolu and Savaii.

12.1. RECRUITMENT PROCESS.

The recruitment process commenced in January 2020 on the issuance of the letter to the Chairman of the Public Service Commission requesting the release of interested public servants for trainings. A form was available online and was given out to anyone who wanted to be part of the process.

12.2. TRAINING.

Training for polling officials commenced in November 2020 with the focus of the first session of trainings on the knowledge and understanding on the different roles and responsibilities

- Phase 1 – Trainings in Roles November 2020.
- This first set of training was conducted in the role in which each individual applied for, and from then the Office noted some of them required changes according to their capacity, their voting constituencies and their affiliation with the candidates. Following this training, assessment was done and allocation to the appropriate roles based on their capacity and experience prior the 2nd phase of trainings.
- Phase 2 – Polling Booth per EC February 2021
- Phase 2 of the trainings was conducted according to the allocation of roles in the confirmed polling booths. The focus of this training was to get the officials familiarized with the polling process, understand different electoral forms and the purpose of the various envelopes. This training was conducted for 10 days with the allocation based on polling booths within electoral constituencies which combined all the roles except for the police officers.
- Phase 3 –Refresher Trainings per EC March 2021
- Observation from the February training noted the need for the Office to undertake one more refresher training in the end of March and one week before the Polls. To ensure the flow and effective of the process, some of the senior public servants including chief executive officers joined polling official team and participated in this training.




Polling Official Trainings

13. DISSOLUTION OF PALIAMENT.

The XVI Parliament of the Independent State of Samoa was officially dissolved on Wednesday 3rd of March, 2021 at the Maota Fono Mulinu. Attended by His Highness the Head of State, Afioga Tuimalealiifano Vaaletoa Sualauvi II, Hon. Prime Minister, Susuga Tuilaepa Dr. Sailele Malielegaoi, Honorable Members of Cabinet and Parliament and the Judiciary of Samoa. Also in attendance were members of the diplomatic corps, the chief executive officers of Government Ministries, heads of Government Departments & Institutions and invited guests.

Writs for General Election were made public on 9th March, 2021.



14. ELECTION PERIOD ACTIVITIES.

14.1. POLLING BOOTHS.

A total of 409 Polling Booths were conveniently allocated throughout the country. There were 338 polling booths for the Election Day and 71 polling booths allocated for Pre Polling. The rationale was to provide ample opportunities for voters to cast their votes within the allocated timeframe, 8am to 3pm.

The allocation of polling stations depended on the size and number of registered voters for each village. Larger villages were allocated two polling booths and smaller villages were allocated one polling booth. Majority of these polling booths were housed at church's halls.

Pre Polling Booths were setup in centralised villages and villages with the high number of voters on the approved pre polling list for each Constituency.

Ten Mobile booths were also setup and operated at the National Hospitals, District Hospitals (Upolu/Savaii), Mapuifagalele, Essential Services and Faleolo Airport only on Election Day.




Figure 5:- Polling booths

Compared to GE 2016, a 14% increase in the number of polling stations was recorded for this Election. The increase was caused by polling booths allocated for pre polling.

They were advertised as required by the Act. (Refer Annex 8).

14.2. DEPLOYMENT.

With the introduction of the Pre-polling process in the beginning of the election week, deployment was conducted on a daily basis from Monday 5th to Thursday 8th of April. Polling officials involved in the pre-polling process did not stay overnight and were picked and dropped off before and after polling. For Savaii, pre-polling was conducted mainly by Officials residing in Savaii with members of the OEC team overseeing the process from day one to day 4.

Deployment of officials for the polling day was done at the Aquatic Centre in Tuanaaimato. All polling officials allocated for polling booth in Savaii departed early Thursday morning at 10.00 on the chartered ferry. Deployment of Savaii was conducted at the Salelologa wharf and most of the transportation provided were catered and offered within the Savaii services.

For Upolu, deployment was scheduled accordingly based on the location of booths. Outer constituencies were the once deployed first and officials allocated in polling booths located in urban area were the last to be deployed.



14.3. PRE POLLING.

Pursuant to Section 61 (1) and (2), a new provision to the Electoral Act allow voters who travels outside of Samoa during the pre-polling period; 65 years old or above and carer of pension holder; a person living with disabilities and carer of the person with disability; and a person employed under Essential Services to cast their votes before polling day if they satisfy the requirements.

Our first process for Pre-Polling started on Monday 3rd August 2020 where white application forms were in place for registration.

This process allowed anyone to uplift pre-polling application forms from the office to be filled in and signed by qualified applicants who were not able to come into the office. At the same time, the office was open for pre-polling registration. However, this registration was closed and no white application forms were accepted as of Wednesday 17th February 2021 due to unlawful act by some of the candidates' committee members through the use of these application forms out to families and communities.

The Pre-Polling period commenced on Monday 5th April 2021 and ended on Thursday 8th April 2021. This was carried out as a mobile booth moving from one village to another in each constituency within the four days of the pre-polling period. All applicants who reside in Upolu but are registered voters in Savaii had Gym 1 at Tuanaaimato available for them to cast their votes for all four days. However, the pre-polling booth that was initially planned to be set up for applicants who are registered voters in Upolu but reside in Savaii was cancelled due to the low number of applicants which could result in no secrecy of voting.

14.4. POLLING DAY.



Polling Day Activities.

Polling Day was held on Friday 9th April 2021. Polling commenced from 8.00am to 3pm.

With our new system implemented by our IT Team in place, the new process required the AEO IT to work together with the Poll Clerk 1 to locate the names of voters and cross them out from the marked booth roll for each constituency before each voters' right hand thumb is marked with an indelible ink to indicate that he/she has already casted his/her vote.

There was a smooth process of dispatch and receive for ballot boxes and stationeries that was held at our operation centre at Tuanaimato Multipurpose Gym. All dispatch was done on Thursday 8th April prior to polling day on Friday 9th April 2021. The Electoral Officers (EOs) along with the security provided by Police Officers were strictly responsible for transporting of ballot boxes back to headquarters. Our work concluded at around 1.00am when ballot boxes used in Savaii were received at our Tuanaimato Operation Centre.

14.5. RELAYING OF RESULTS.

At the close of polling, preliminary results were relayed via WhatsApp. We noticed the rapid response by polling officials with their results coming in right after the preliminary counts were done at their respective polling booths.

Upon receipt, results were not only manually recorded on black boards within the Multipurpose Gym but were also posted on the office Facebook page – Office of the Electoral Commission – Samoa.

14.6. OFFICIAL COUNT.


The Official Count process started a day after polling, on Saturday 10th April 2021. The usual task was the sorting of special votes to corresponding Constituencies in the presence of scrutineers. This task commenced at 11am on Saturday until 12am midnight and resumed again at 12pm on Sunday and finished at 2am Monday morning.

The official count started on Monday 12th April where ballot boxes were opened in the presence of Candidates scrutineers, media representatives, observers and Police Officers.

Every ballot paper was verified to ensure that each contained an official booth mark. Votes were then sorted according to Candidates and were then counted.

Counting Officers completed a result slip on which the results of total votes were reconciled with the number of ballot papers issued for each Polling Booth. Candidate scrutineers after verifying the results signed off on the result slips.

It was obvious that there were candidates that did not send scrutineers and their absence did not invalidate the process.

After the official count, one candidate who won following the Preliminary Count lost after the special votes were counted. The rest remained the same despite a slight increase in votes as a result of special votes.

The official count results were advertised by way of a public notice (Refer Annex) and reported to the Head of State from which a Warrant of Election for the successful candidates was issued under proclamation. (Refer Annex).

Returned Candidates After General Election




Figure 6:- Returned Candidates





PERCENTAGE OF VOTES PER CANDIDATE







14.8. FEMALE CANDIDATES.

The Constitutional Amendment Act was passed in June 2013 which allowed for a minimum of six (6) Women Parliamentarians during this Parliamentary Term. This translates to 10% of the current 51 Seats representing 51 Constituencies according to our new Electoral Act.

The 10% quota for women parliamentarians was administered following the Official count and was contested in court for further clarification as the number of seats been changed from 49 to 51 during this new term. As a result one seat was needed to satisfy the quota to make up for six women parliamentarians as per court decision.

For the 2021 General Election a total of twenty two (22) Female Candidates were nominated, one short compared to the 2016 Election

Out of the 22, only 5 women made it through and elected as MPs of their respective Constituencies. This triggers Section 44 1A of the Constitution which requires 6 women MPs to be in Parliament.

15. POST ELECTION ACTIVITIES.

15.1. VOTER TURNOUT.

Overall Registered Voters and Votes Cast Compared.

Table 21 below illustrates the total number of votes casted (89,587 for 2021) and (80,711 for 2016) compared to the number of registered voters (128,822 for 2021) and (115,891 for 2016). The difference is that the number of people who were registered but did not cast their votes is (32,525 or 27%) for 2021 and (30,258 or 27%) for 2016. Hence in the 2021 General Election 73% of those registered casted their votes while 27% did not.

The three unopposed Constituencies (Faleata 3, Lotofaga, and Lepa) with 6683 total number of registered voters did not take part in the 2021 Election. This is compared to four unopposed Constituencies (Lotofaga, Lepa, Aleipata Itupa i Luga, Satupaitea) in the 2016 GE. Thus the number of votes casted during the 2021 Elections could be higher if those 6683 registered voters took part in the process.

Overall the number of registered voters for 2021 GE is increased by 10% but those who casted their votes increased by 9.9%.




Figure 8:- Comparison of Votes Casted & Registered Voters

15.2 Registered Voters and Votes Cast by Constituencies Official Count Results 2021.

Table 22 outlines the number of registered voters (total roll), number of votes casted including informal and formal votes, and the proportion of votes casted to the electoral roll of every Constituency in the 2021 General Election.

Table 22 is sorted by Constituencies with the highest proportion of votes casted compared to total registered voters. In the 2021 General Election, the majority of constituencies had 70 – 78% of registered voters who casted their votes with Palauli 2 holding the highest proportion of 78%. Seven constituencies (Vaimauga 4, Lefaga & Faleaseela, Falealili 1, Falealili 2, Aleipata Itupa I Luga, Vaisigano 1 and Falealupo had 66% - 69% of registered voters who casted their votes.

Three constituencies (Faleata 3, Lotofaga and Lepa) were uncontested in this General Election.




Figure 9:- Registered voters And Votes Casted

Proportion: Vote Casted to Registered Voters by Constituency




Figure 10:- Proportion of Voters Casted to Registered Voters by Constituency

15.3. COMPARISON IN TERMS OF VOTES CAST IN PROPORTION TO REGISTERED VOTERS IN GE2016 AND GE2021




Figure 11- Percentage of Voters Casted in Proportion to Registered Voters in General Elections 2016 & 2021

Figure 11 given below shows a comparison of Votes Casted in proportion to the total number of Registered Voters for 2016 and 2021. The comparison per constituency is unfortunately inaccurate due to the change of constituencies from Territorial Constituencies to Electoral Constituencies under the Electoral Act 2019.

In comparison to the 2016 GE, 5 constituencies received 80-87% and 31 constituencies received 70-79% votes casted in proportion to registered voters whereas in 2021 GE, 41 constituencies received 70-78% with Palauli 2 at 78% and 7 constituencies received 66-69% with Aleipata Itupa i Luga at the lowest of 66%. 4 seats were uncontested in 2016 GE compared to the 3 that were uncontested in the 2021 GE.




Figure 12:- Votes Cast by Age & Gender




Figure 13 - Votes Received by each Party.

16. DUAL VOTES.

The following table shows the number of dual votes from each Constituency. As per the table, only 13 out of the 48 constituencies that contested had dual votes with Vaimauga 1 and Faleata 2 having the highest number of dual votes.

Most dual votes that were noted by Polling Officials on Polling Day and during the official count were reviewed and corrected by our Office.

One of the common causes of dual votes is the wrongly marking of the Booth marked roll by PC1.





Figure 14:- Dual Votes.

17. PARLIAMENT TURNOVER.

After the official count, twenty one (21) members from the previous Parliamentary term returned with 30 new members to make up for the 51 seats of the seventeenth (XVII) parliamentary term. In terms of Parliament turnover in percentages, this Election recorded a 59% turnover from the last Parliament.




Figure 15 - Parliament Turnover

18. ELECTORAL PROSECUTION.

Generally, electoral prosecution matters are lodged directly with the Ministry of Police, Prisons & Correction Services (“MPPCS”) however, a person may also bring his or her matter to our Office and we initiate the investigation before forwarding the file to the MPPCS to officially investigate any criminal electoral allegation.

As such, there are currently few matters on criminal electoral offences that were forwarded to MPPCS for their investigation and those matters are still ongoing.

In regards to Prosecutorial matters arising from corrupt and illegal practices leading up to or during the General Election 2021, our Legal Team are currently awaiting the Supreme Court Report at the complete of electoral petition matters whereby the Supreme Court will have identified those whom the Supreme Court has proven guilty of an offence.

There were originally twenty-eight (28) election petitions filed in the Supreme Court against the winning candidates for the Constituencies of Vaimauga 1, Vaimauga 3, Faleata 1, Sagaga 1, Sagaga 2, Sagaga 4, Aana Alofi 1, Aana Alofi 2, Aana Alofi 3, Aana Alofi 4, Aiga i le Tai, Falelatai & Samatau, Lefaga & Faleaseela, Safata 1, Safata 2, Siumu, Falealili 2, Aleipata Itupa i Lalo, Anoamaa 2, Faasaleleaga 1, Faasaleleaga 2, Faasaleleaga 3, Gagaemauga 1, Gagaifomauga 2, Vaisigano 1, Falealupo, Salega 1 and Palauli 1 when the results of the poll was publicly notified by the Commissioner. Ten (10) days was given for those Candidates who were unsuccessful but made 50% total polled numbers to the successful Candidate to file their petitions.

As a result, seventeen (17) petitions were withdrawn which were from the Constituencies of Vaimauga 1, Vaimauga 3, Sagaga 1, Aana Alofi 1, Aana Alofi 4, Aiga i le Tai, Falelatai & Samatau, Lefaga & Faleaseela, Safata 1, Siumu, Anoamaa 2, Faasaleleaga 1, Faasaleleaga 2, Faasaleleaga 3, Gagaemauga 1, Gagaifomauga 2, Vaisigano 1 and Palauli 1 and eleven (11) went through trial. Of the eleven (11) election petitions that went through trial; four (4) petitions were dismissed by the court which were from the Constituency of Faleata 1, Aana Alofi 3, Faasaleleaga 2 and Salega 1; four (4) who were elected members were found guilty of corrupt practices and their election were declared void which were the constituencies of Sagaga 2, Aana Alofi 2, Falealili 2 and Aleipata Itupa i Lalo; and three (3) elected members opted to resign as an elected member from their respective constituencies, these were members of the constituencies of Sagaga 4, Safata 2 and Falealupo.

As of the time of this report, seven (7) constituencies are about to go the polls again for by-elections as a result from elections being voided by the Court.

20. ISSUES AND RECOMMENDATIONS



The Office of the Electoral Commissioner experienced a number of issues leading up to the General Elections. Listed below are some of the issues;

1. Consider nomination period for general election candidates to revert back to after the dissolution of parliament.
2. Remove compulsory voting. It is almost impossible to administer and also had little impact of voter turnout.
3. Relook into the qualifications of pre-pollers
4. Develop and establish a manual for the operations of General Election and By-Elections
5. Re-visit the candidate eligibility on monotaga and previous convictions.
